- 9.07 The programme of the championship has been discussed at the previous Team Captains Meeting and agreed upon, it is also available in the distributed bulletin
- 9.08 Drawing procedure
- parallel start system will be used in 7 out of 9 categories

- special proceeding – can be done only by computer, similarly as in European Championships in France and tested as good
 - there will be 3 start lists and envelopes prepared and 1 person will draw the start list
- 9.09 The jury approved the use of digital and other cameras, etc.
- detailed description of waiting area, start area and corridors and proposed movement of visitors, press, team captains, etc.
 - agreed that that only one way traffic is allowed
 - at the waiting area – cameras allowed
 - at the starting area only competitors are allowed and they must have their accreditation cards available
 - other electronic devices such as walkman, mobile telephones and radios are strictly forbidden
- 9.30 question – no. of societies and competitors taking part in the competition
- 29-30 societies
 - approximately 300 competitors expected, but this is not a final number
 - it is a new record since it is the first time that 29 or more societies take part
- 9.31 – the start numbers will be seen both at the chest and the back of the competitors, in order to be seen by the referees
- 9.32 - referees will mechanically write notes in order to have backcheck of the computer in case of problems
- 9.33 In case that there is trouble with sport idents and marking – the competitor should call out his/her number in order to be noted own by the referee
- 9.34 Chips will be distributed together with the start lists at the Team Captain Meeting in the evening at 7 pm
- 9.35 Towards 2 permits that were received (NOR, NED) the jury had no objections
- in case that there are some other spare permits within the national teams, than the permits must be made available to the organising committee
- 9.36 Closing of the meeting, next International Jury Meeting will be held at 7.30 after the Team Captains Meeting today
